Why do we treat prayer as a “Last \_\_\_\_\_” instead of a “Loving \_\_\_\_\_”?

“Prayer should not be regarded as a \_\_\_\_\_ which must be performed, but rather as a \_\_\_\_\_ to be enjoyed, a rare \_\_\_\_\_ that is always revealing some new beauty.” - E.M. Bounds

- I. Jesus emphasized our prayers must begin in \_\_\_\_\_ (v.5-6) :
  - A. Hypocritical prayers are only offered out of \_\_\_\_\_ and public \_\_\_\_\_.
  - B. Public prayers devoid of \_\_\_\_\_ prayers are often driven by \_\_\_\_\_ motives.
- II. Jesus emphasized our prayers must be \_\_\_\_\_ (v.7) :

  - C. There are three things which Jesus wants to see in our prayers:
